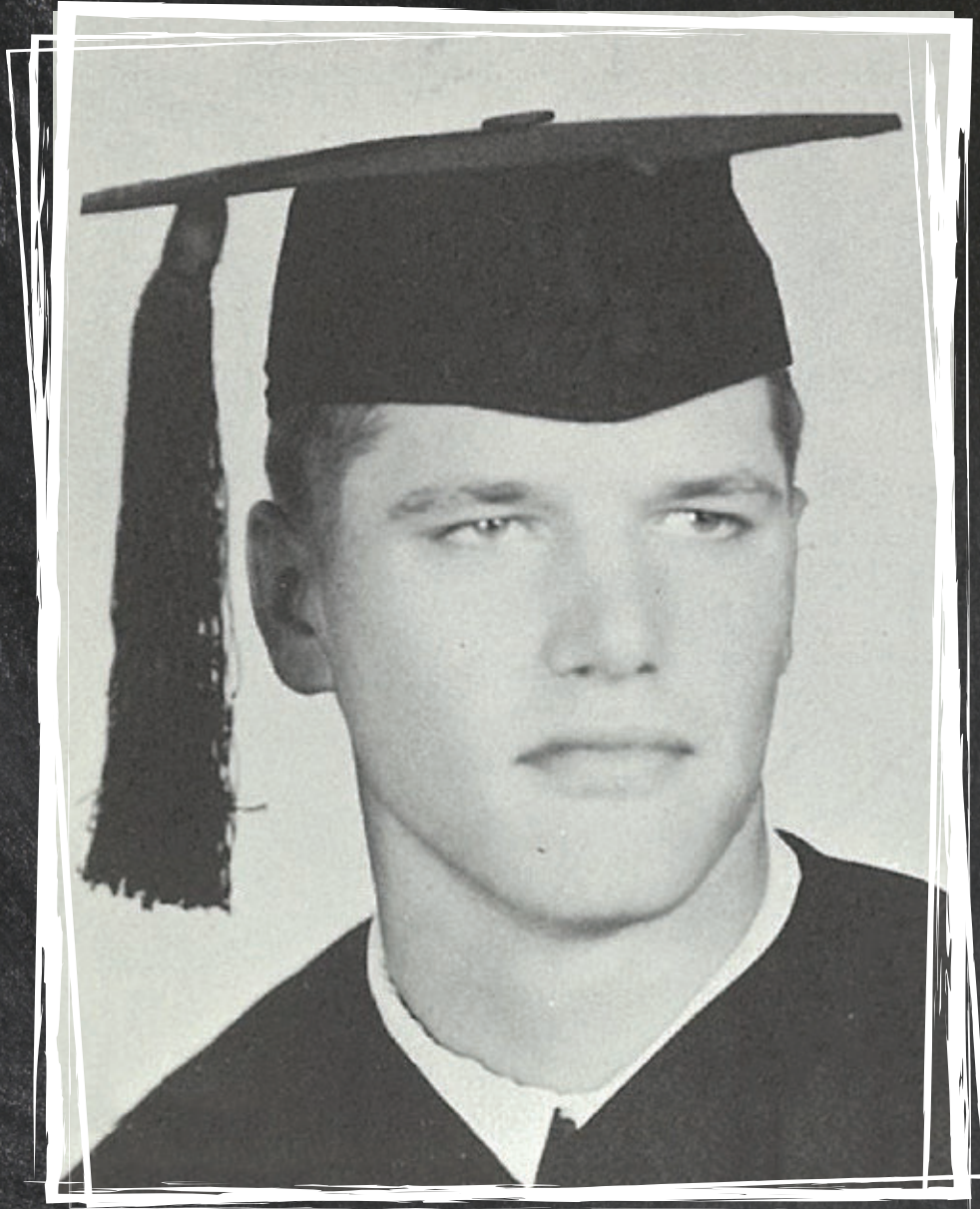

If you have spent any time during the last 68 years on the Sacred Heart Catholic School campus, odds are you have seen SHCS alumnus Sylvan Walterscheid quietly setting the example Jesus asks us all to do in serving one another.

Sylvan attended grade school in the historic red brick building. His Freshman through Junior years of high school, classes were held in the old Tin University building with pride and excitement, SHCS seniors began to be sent to high school in the newly constructed high school which still serves our students today. Sylvan served multiple terms on the Sacred Heart Catholic School Board. He was also a board member of the Sacred Heart Trust Fund and the Sacred Heart Center.

Whether in the St Cecilia's choir, serving as an officer of the 4-H Club, serving as class officer, receiving All State honors as Center and Co-Captain of the football team or, playing basketball and baseball for the Sacred Heart Tigers, Sylvan displayed loyalty and love for his school. Sylvan found another kind of love while attending SHCS. He and fellow classmate,eresa Mae Feidermo, began dating their Senior year, which led to their marriage in May, 1958, resulting in four children who also graduated from SHCS: Danny '78, Laurie '79, Greg '83, and Amy '90.

TECHNOLOGY UPDATE



In the year 2000, Sacred Heart students a class called Advanced Technology. The class was taught by Mrs. Bayer for the school year 2000-2001. Mrs. Bayer up to provide funds that allowed as technology aides. The school as technology aides. The school for student use and to purchase Chromebooks for teacher use, which remained high. Mrs. Bayer know that she was training 2022, alumna Tina Taylor one of her students, Nicholas Taylor 2011, to one day take her place as principal. The Alumni granted \$30,000 to the school for the purposes of upgrading a college degree, Taylor quickly set to work before returning to Sacred Heart. By December 2022, a new server was ordered for the school and installed over the Christmas holiday. To bring the school's network up to date, Taylor began working with Nortex Communications. In 2025, current teacher computer can not support Windows 11 so necessary to obtain new computer cables to replace teacher computers. Work on this project was completed approximately \$25,000, a sum of money. Technology fund help support that much of the school's technology needs of Sacred Heart. 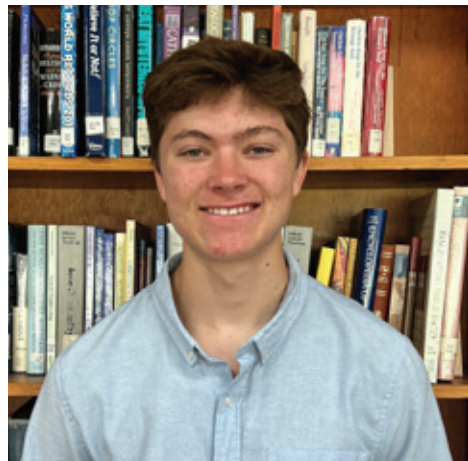
