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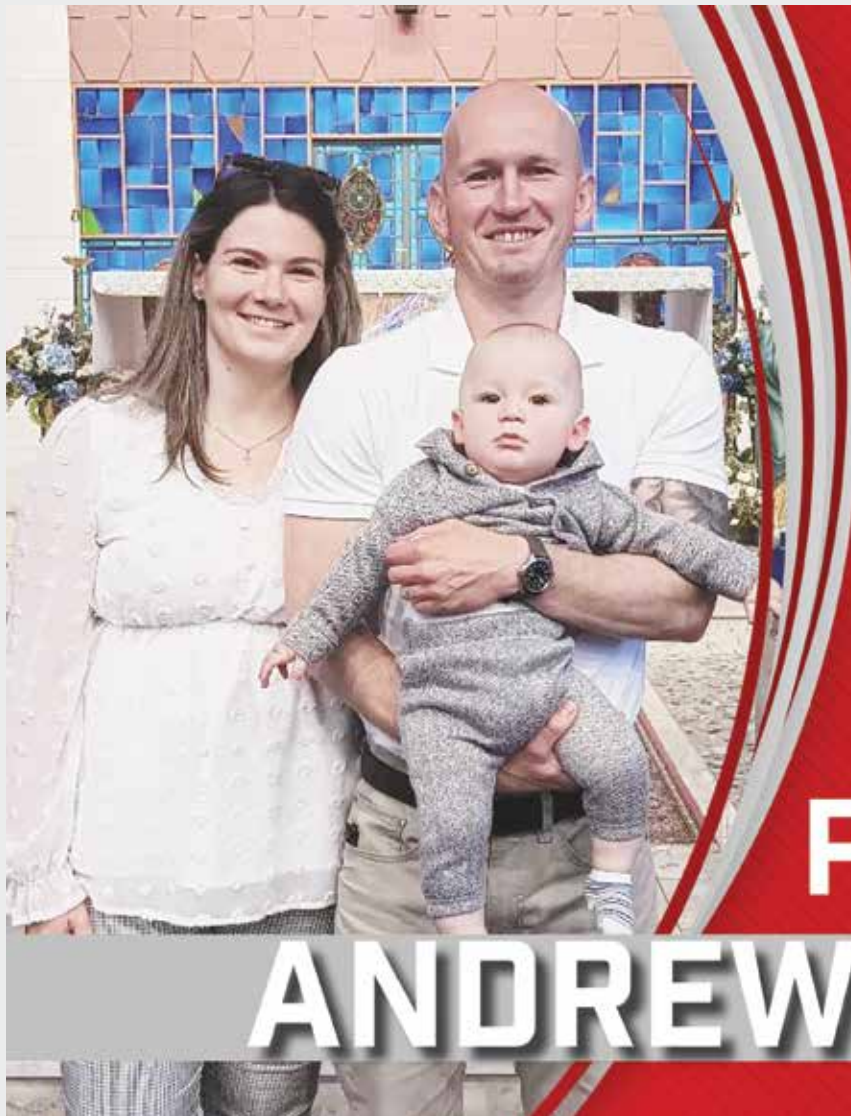

LYDIA SPRINGER - NEW DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT FOR SH PARISH



Sacred Heart alumna Lydia Walterscheid Springer ('86) comes full circle as she is named Director of Development for Sacred Heart Parish. She will be sharing her time with the Diocese of Fort Worth's Advancement Foundation, where she serves as the Regional Director of Development. Having attended 1st-12th grades at Sacred Heart Catholic School, Lydia is excited to now assist parents, grandparents and friends of the school and parish with Planned Giving.

A graduate of the University of Dallas and Southern Methodist University School of Law, Lydia maintained her own legal practice for more than twenty years. "Much of my time was spent creating estate plans including wills and trusts. My goal was always to listen to my clients and provide the planning necessary to accomplish their wishes through proper planning." Lydia went on to say, "We all have heard the expression 'you can't take it with you when you go' – so what kind of legacy do you want to leave behind? What can you do now to ensure that your wishes are respected, and your family is taken care of?"

Since 2003, Lydia has assisted in a volunteer capacity as Sacred Heart

School's Director of Development. During this time, she has set up numerous Endowed Scholarship Funds whereby with as little as \$10,000, an individual or family can create a gift that can last "forever" – donors may direct that only the interest, or even just a portion of the interest is used so the principal remains intact, even continues to grow, in perpetuity.

Additionally, donors may designate the Parish, School or Trust Fund as the sole or partial beneficiary of their IRA, Retirement Plan, Insurance Policy or Annuity. They may include SH as the sole or partial beneficiary on checking, savings and investment accounts. And, for those seeking tax benefits for appreciated assets, donors may

consider a Charitable Remainder Trust where their family benefits during their life, with a gift going to their charity of choice at their passing. Donor Advised Funds also provide favorable tax treatment and allow the donor to name the gift recipients. Regardless of the size of the gift, all are so important for keeping our beloved school strong and stable for generations to come.

TECHNOLOGY DONATIONS

Technology is always evolving, bringing new opportunities and challenges. At Sacred Heart Catholic School, keeping up with these changes is crucial. Since becoming the technology director in Fall 2020, Nicholas Taylor has been dedicated to ensuring the school's technology remains current, retiring obsolete devices and replacing them with modern alternatives. Financial constraints often make these upgrades challenging, but thanks to generous benefactors, the school can continue to enhance its technological infrastructure.

Sacred Heart Alumni and Supporters have been instrumental in facilitating donations for previous upgrades. In December 2022, a new, modern server was ordered and installed over the Christmas holiday. To bring the school's network infrastructure up to date, a new firewall, network switches and wireless access points were installed in June 2023.

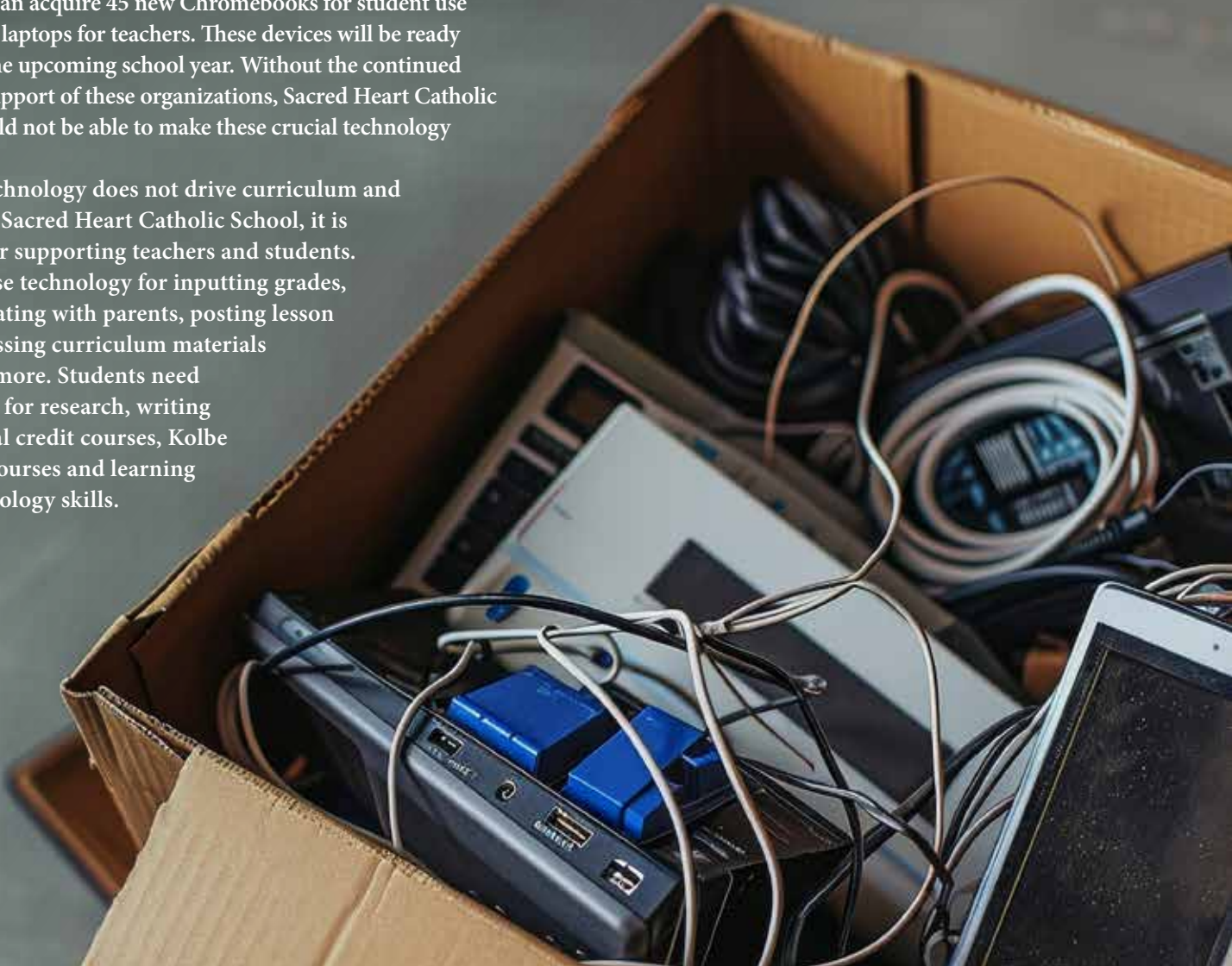
The latest technology needs include new Chromebooks for students and new Windows laptops for teachers. Many existing Chromebooks are no longer receiving updates from Google due to their age. Additionally, most teachers are currently using laptops running Windows 10, which Microsoft will stop supporting in 2025. These older devices do not meet the system requirements for Windows 11, making replacements essential to ensure security and compatibility with the latest software.

Thanks to substantial donations from Sacred Heart Alumni and Supporters and the Alvin and Gracie Fuhrman Foundation, the school can acquire 45 new Chromebooks for student use and 26 new laptops for teachers. These devices will be ready for use in the upcoming school year. Without the continued generous support of these organizations, Sacred Heart Catholic School would not be able to make these crucial technology upgrades.

While technology does not drive curriculum and learning at Sacred Heart Catholic School, it is essential for supporting teachers and students. Teachers use technology for inputting grades, communicating with parents, posting lesson plans, accessing curriculum materials and much more. Students need technology for research, writing papers, dual credit courses, Kolbe Academy courses and learning basic technology skills.

Additionally, student assessments such as Accelerated Reader (AR), Assessment of Religious Knowledge (ARK), Classical Learning Test (CLT) and Preliminary Scholarly Aptitude Test (PSAT) are now administered exclusively online.

Given the ever-changing nature of technology, ongoing upgrades will be necessary to meet the needs of teachers and students. Donations to the Gene Fuhrmann Technology Fund are vital for supporting these needs. I miss him and would love to have one more conversation with him. Also, Fr. Stephen, as a football coach and religion teacher, taught me about hard work and being steadfast. All these great teachers and mentors are part of my essence and are remembered fondly for their impact on my life and spiritual development.”

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

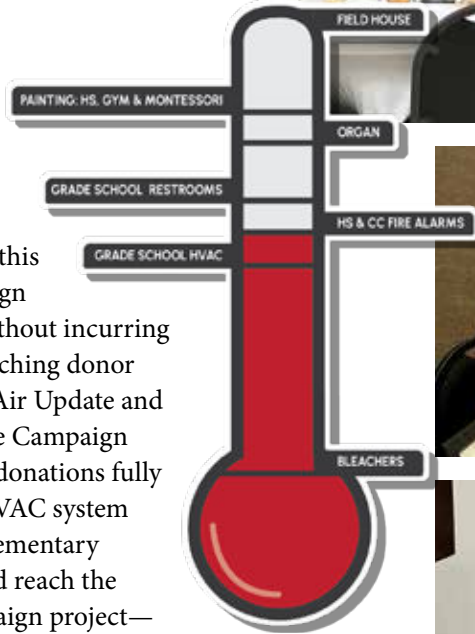
The Sacred Heart Parish Capital Campaign is halfway towards its celebration goal of \$3M! Reaching this milestone will allow for all Campaign Projects to be completed in full, without incurring any debt. Thanks to the \$100K matching donor and all contributors at the Heat & Air Update and Fundraising Event on April 7th, the Campaign raised over \$300K that day! Those donations fully funded installation of a modern HVAC system in the 100 year old Sacred Heart elementary building. The donations also helped reach the fundraising goal for the next campaign project—installation of fire alarms in the SH high school building and community center.

HVAC installation in the elementary building is underway and contracted to be completed this summer before the 2024-25 school year begins in August. The modern HVAC system will replace the old window units and antiquated boiler system, providing a more comfortable learning environment for both students and teachers.

Fire alarm installation for the Sacred Heart high school building and community center will be the next project on the docket. The current fire alarm system in both the high school and community center are in urgent need of proper updating to be compliant with the modern fire code.

Renovation of the Sacred Heart elementary restrooms will follow the fire alarm project. Restoration to the girls and boys elementary restrooms are in dire need to make them ADA compliant and allow for increased privacy for students. Paul T. Bartush Jr. ('05) has generously offered to donate the labor for the restroom renovation project. We hope to see more supporters in the community and alumni, far and wide, join in contributing to help complete the funding. 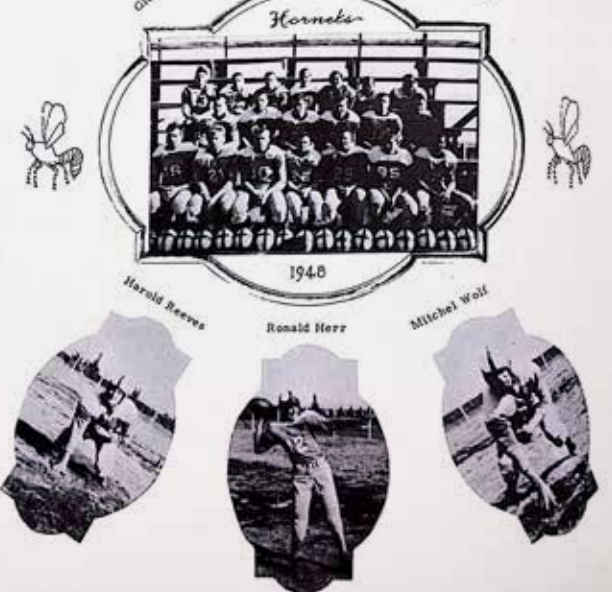

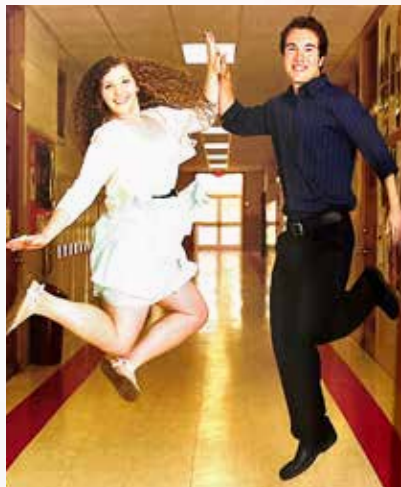

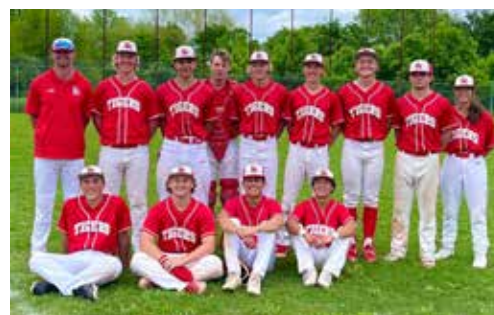
SPRING ACADEMICS AND ATHLETICS

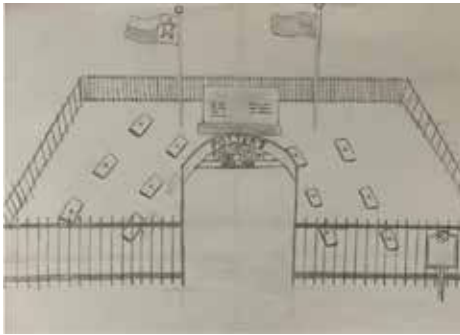

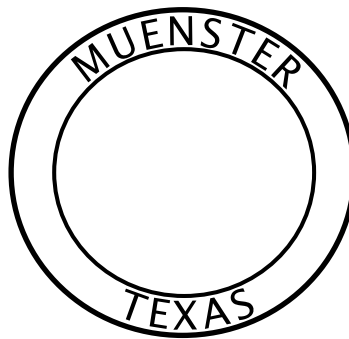
