OVERVIEW

Sacred Heart is a coeducational, open admission Catholic school in partnership with the Fort Worth Diocese. SHCS provides a well-rounded Catholic education to students representing diverse academic and socioeconomic backgrounds. Our educational programs include Montessori (PreK3 - Kindergarten), Elementary (Grades 1 - 5), Junior High (Grades 6 - 8) and High School (Grades 9 - 12). SHCS is located in Muenster, TX, a quaint German Catholic community just 1.5 hours north of DFW. Transportation is offered for out-of-town students via a daily bus route from Denton.

ENROLLMENT

- 190 students in grades PK3 - 12 for 2023-24 school year
- The SHCS Graduating Class of 2024 had 17 students
- 23% of our students receive some form of tuition assistance.

FACULTY

- There are 24 teachers and administrators, and of those 17% hold advanced degrees.
- 42% of our teachers hold multiple certificates through the state of Texas.
- The average teaching experience is 16.9 years.
- The student to teacher ratio for each level:
Montessori 11:1, Elementary 11:1, Junior High 13:1, High School 11:1.

HONORS CLASSES

SHCS offers Geometry Honors and Algebra II Honors with 25% of the HS population enrolled in either of these courses for 2023-2024.

DUAL CREDIT CLASSES

SHCS has a dual credit partnership with North Central Texas College. Currently 23.6% of our high school students are enrolled in at least one dual credit online course. For GPA calculation purposes, students receive a 6 point bonus for all dual credit courses in which a grade of 86 or higher is earned.

FAITH FORMATION

The faith at Sacred Heart is unwavering.

MASS

- Students in grades 1-12 attend Mass three times a week, with over 90 Masses attended per school year
- Students participate in Mass regularly as altar servers, cantors and lectors

RELIGIOUS FORMATION CLASS

- Religious formation classes are attended by all students on a daily basis, with students receiving over 6,600 minutes of religious instruction per school year

ADORATION

- Students in grades 1-12 attend Adoration on a weekly basis, with approximately 1,500 minutes spent in Adoration per school year

SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

- Students are encouraged to perform works of service and mercy through school-sponsored mission trips, vocation trips, community service opportunities, weekly mission collections and outreach
- High school students are required to complete 25 hours of Christian Ministry volunteer service hours per school year

SPECIAL RESOURCES

Students with learning disabilities, physical impairments or behavioral challenges are diagnosed through a partnering educational services department. Individual Education Plans (IEPs) are developed for students and modifications implemented in the classroom. SHCS has a dedicated special resources instructor for elementary students and offers the Scottish Rite *Take Flight* and BUILD programs for students at risk or diagnosed with developmental dyslexia. Speech services for students are also available through a licensed Speech Language Pathologist.

SAFETY & SECURITY

SHCS operates a closed and fully locked campus, secured by video cameras. All individuals involved in any capacity with SHCS including staff, volunteers and students must have safe environment training.
